




David Van Dyke won the 50/50 cash prize and put it back in the pot to let the pot grow so the next time he wins he can buy Venezuela and straighten that place out.

If you have a convertible and would like to join, socialize and parade with a fun group, we meet on the Wednesday of the second full week of the month. We will meet at the parades during the summer months.




RADOPS BYMICHAEL MARCUS

The Radops is proud to announce our UHF Repeater was brought back on the air during the afternoon of February 27, 2019. This repeater has been off the air since moving from the Shrine's former location a few years ago. We'd like to thank two of our members who were instrumental in obtaining its current location and for getting it installed and fully operational: Rich Wall WR1CH and Emit Hurdelbrink W0UAW!

Although we are not giving out the exact address of the repeater for security reasons, we can tell you it is located in the east side of the metro area near I-225 and Parker Road. Its location was donated by the Heather Gardens Association. The Repeater's frequency is 447.925 MHz, with the standard offset and a 100Hz PL Tone to access it. This information is intended for all Radops members and any other licensed HAM Operator. Additionally, this repeater is open to all ham radio operators and any emergency communications as needed.



Picture of Emit (W0UAW) after the repeater was installed.




Picture of the antenna while the hardware was being installed on the tower.

PIPE BAND By Kent Burns



We all lived through St. Patrick's Day – that day when everyone suddenly sprouts Irish roots, develops a taste for beer (especially if it's green or has a name with inferences of Ireland like Killian's or Guinness), dines on corned beef and cabbage, and acknowledges a belief in pots 'o gold and leprechauns. And let's not forget the obligatory parade, no matter what the weather. That cooperated this year, with no precipitation and fairly warm temperatures. Although Irish stew was substituted for corned beef, all the other affectations were in abundance at the after-parade party at Highlands Temple. This was the second "annual" such event, started last year by then-Chief Rabban now Ill Sir Bobby. Let's hope it continues – the proverbial "good time was had by all" was again true this year.


We were again privileged to play two concerts with the Rocky Mountain Brassworks in March – one in Parker and one in Broomfield. We miss all those times Bill Smith came up with chances to play with his AFA drum and bugle corps before he retired, and look forward to performing with brass bands whenever we can. There is something about the skirl of the pipes tempered with the mellower tones of brass instruments that is highly addicting. And all of us in the Pipe Band are so afflicted.

One of the many reasons playing with brass is so much fun is those other instruments can play those pesky little notes known as accidentals, or sharps and flats. Last time we spoke of the nine notes "available" on bagpipes, and how certain melodies have to be altered to "sound familiar" on pipes. Another "problem" with pipes is differentiating between notes, especially the same note that should be heard as several individual notes instead of one longer and continuous one. For those who have played an instrument or have been introduced to the necessity of playing the "D" several times in succession (such as at the ending of God Bless America or Amazing Grace), the answer is obvious. On piano, the player simply hits the same key the appropriate number of times. In those instruments where the notes come from blowing into it, those successive notes are formed by "tonguing" the note - literally sticking your tongue out into the air stream thus interrupting it – the required number of times to produce the number of times the note is written in the music. But pipes have a steady, uninterrupted air stream. Although the piper blows into the bag, there is no way to interrupt the air-flow out of the bag through those other "thingies" that stick out of it – the chanter (where the tune is played) and the drones (which provide the steady note).

So the ancients came up with an answer: They are collectively called "grace notes" and are simply a quick different note played to provide the required (by the composer/arranger) number of (in this example) "D"s. In effect, they are sixty-fourth notes that are not "counted" in the measure but actually "steal" their allotted time from the other notes. Sound confusing? It is rather simple, unless you want to know the upwards of twenty or so different names for the various grace notes found in pipe music. They look like fly-specks on the paper, and lend an all-new meaning to the old admonition "Play the ink!" The listener doesn't really hear a grace note *per say* but rather enough of an interruption of the main note to hear several (in this example) "D"s. It's really fairly simple.

Should there be any out there who would like to explore the application of all this new-found knowledge, the Band meets every Thursday evening at the Shrine at 1900 (or 7:00pm for the uninitiated). Come on down for the fun!


