

Well, as they say, we made it through Estes (Park). For most, this festival is the end of the competition season, the culmination of the summer, the last hurral for structured kilted activities. Once the third largest Highland Games in the country, it was sad to see how small the attendance was. And the participation was not exactly record-setting either. Not that long ago, we could expect 200-250 pipers and drummers on the field at massed bands and last post. There would be guest bands from Canada, maybe Scotland or Australia, and closer places like Kansas City who contributed one band, two or three from Utah, New Mexico would send one or two. And these were just the pipe bands. The Marines usually sent a band (in fact, they were the one band that did not play the year it snowed the night before the parade and they thought it "too cold" - did they ever get teased about that!); the Army sent the Old Guard or "Escort to the President" (the 3rd U.S. Infantry Regiment who wore Revolutionary War uniform complete with tri-cornered hats and whose drum major is the only member of the Armed Forces allowed to salute with his left hand as he carries a spear rather than a mace in his right); NORAD sent their commander who would officially open the games; etc., etc. They would have a fly-over. The festival would brag about the crowds, usually in the 30,000+ range.

Even the weather has been different lately. It has never showed on the actual parade on Saturday morning. The worst snow was the aforementioned Friday night event that collapsed and destroyed tents, and left a pile of the white stuff all over the field, although the streets were fairly clear and dry. However, the snow was so wet that it didn't take long to melt, and when it did, there were rivers of water running down the hills around the fairground field and a shallow but fairly large lake that took in most of the field, vendor tents, clan tents, and all means of egress. Sure did take its toll on our white spats! That stirrup that runs under the shoe to keep the spat in place makes a great wick and, naturally, the water is less than clean, so white spats became gray very quickly and took several washings complete with bleach to turn white again. The October meeting will be at the Shrine on October 8 at 1:00. We will have lunch at the Kennedy Tavern if they are open. Program to be announced via email.




