could help her walk again. She had 13 surgeries before 18 years old. The Bright procedure was used to help her leg to grow, and it worked. Arletta then talked about the holistic care the Shriners Hospital provided to all the children; schooling, church, socializing, that made life worth living. Parents, doctors, staff taught the value of giving back. Arletta had paralysis early in her treatment. One example of giving she discussed was a Shriner that prayed with her and took her to Sunday School that gave her the power to endure the pain and treatments. Her first hospital stay was three months. Later, in school, she became a cheerleader and continued this activity throughout her school years. The whole experience was so great that her 16-year-old brother wanted to volunteer at a Shriners Hospital! The Potentate and all thanked Arletta for her inspiring story.





#### Greetings and Happy June!

COVID restrictions being lifted are cause to celebrate. However, the month of June brings us a few special days.

Shriners International Awareness Day (June 6) - In 1876, the Imperial Council, the original governing body of the Shriners fraternity, was founded. To honor this important milestone in Shriners history, Shriners International has declared June 6 as Shriners International Awareness Day. The governor of Colorado has also signed a proclamation recognizing Shriners awareness day on June 6, 2021.

**Flag Day** (June 14) - Commemorates the adoption of the flag of the United States on June 14, 1777, by resolution of the Second Continental Congress. Over 100 years later, in 1916, President Woodrow Wilson marked the anniversary of that decree by officially establishing June 14 as Flag Day.

Father's Day (June 20) Founded in Spokane, Washington at the YMCA in 1910 by Sonora Smart Dodd. The first celebration was in the Spokane YMCA on June 19, 1910. Her father, the Civil War veteran William Jackson Smart, was a single parent who raised his six children there. In 1966, President Lyndon B. Johnson issued the first presidential proclamation honoring fathers, designating the third Sunday in June as Father's Day.

**St John Baptist Day** (June 24) – The birthday of one of Masonry's patron saints. Also marks the summer solstice, when nature attains the zenith of light and life and joy. The Gospel of Saint John is considered the most Masonic of the Gospels because its central theme is LIGHT.

Our values as Masons and Shriners are integrated in these special days. Celebrate, enjoy but most of all BE PROUD TO BE A MASON and SHRINER!

## PIPE BAND By KENT BURNS



May was a wonderful month! And one of the busiest months of late, reminiscent of those times fifteen or so years ago when the Band was busy all the time (200+ performances a year). Most of the month's performances were for veterans, starting with two Honor Flights and ending with the Memorial Day weekend. However, the highlight of the entire month – and most likely the entire year - was the second Honor Flight of the month which we played as RP&B with the cadets of the AFA Drum and Bugle Corps. We started the day warming up with them in a parking lot near the American Legion building in Aurora. We then used the performance for their "burger burn" (catchy name for a picnic) as a rehearsal for the Honor Flight later that evening. There was a car show (similar to the English Car Show we play every mid-September in Arvada) and a great band called Scarecrow Revival (which I would highly recommend seeing). The Legion then fed us hamburgers with the usual trimmings.

When they designed DIA, I doubt if acoustics (or lack thereof) were in the design specs. But somehow the finished product resulted in a venue with the best acoustics we have ever played. This show ranks up there with the notorious Lee "No-show" Greenwood performance and the Honor Flight performance following Tartan Day several years ago (both with the cadets) as the best and most memorable for the Band. We had the day recorded and made into a DVD, just like the one for our halftime performance for the Steelers/Broncos AFC championship game of January, 2006. Some of it can also be found on YouTube under Red, Plaid, and Blue ~ The Instruments of War.

The band never accepts money for performances connected with veterans. We play for the return of every Honor Flight (of which there are at least four a year) and have done so for fifteen years. The debt Americans owe our veterans can never be paid in full. The Honor Flights are an acknowledgment of that debt and but a tiny installment against it. We are honored to be a part of them. There is a rumor going around there will be a special on this Honor Flight on Channel 20, KDTV Sunday, 3 June 2017 at 2130 (that's 9:30 pm for some). Might want to check local listings – sorta sounds like a sign-off of some late night TV show! (But then, since it is the regular news at that time, don't be disappointed if the Flight is only briefly mentioned.)

Knowing there would be a crowd, we invited a lovely young lady to join us as an Irish step-dancer. Renae Marshall can dance to anything and everything, and she "wow-ed" the crowd with some really fancy steppin'! We are hoping to have more performances this summer at which she can dance for everyone before she goes off to Loyola of Chicago this fall.

The good weather we hoped for almost deserted us at the Greeley High School Graduation. The clouds portended heavy rain (or maybe even some of that solid stuff) but we escaped getting wet – albeit just barely. However, as soon as we were done, the rain started. Don't know how the graduation fared – we were long gone by then. We finished the Memorial Day weekend (and our busy month of May) with two performances on Memorial Day. The first was a VFW memorial at Littleton Cemetery and then over to Ketring Park for a similar memorial at the WWII Memorial. That one was particularly heart-warming as there was a WWII veteran there over 100-years-old who had been on Iwo Jima.

While we all should hold our veterans in the highest esteem, one of the speakers made a great point, and one rarely mentioned. The families of these heroes are very often overlooked. Even as we honor the veterans on their "days," we forget their families. Therefore, for the families, I would suggest: They endured the uncertainty associated with war, although not the immediate danger. They endured the agony of loss of loved ones, although not that of wounds. They endured the loneliness of death of loved ones, although not that felt in a foxhole on a battleground. They should be remembered for their sacrifices as well, if only by acclimation.

In the meantime, the Band is still working toward improving our craft. We can be found almost every Thursday evening at the Shrine Center at 1900, should any be interested in joining our group.



On May 15th, the Medical Staff met for the second time in 2021 with ONLY three members and four Ladies attending. The attendance was disappointing. Apparently, the Medical Staff is not the only Unit that is experiencing low attendance at meetings. In order for El Jebel to thrive and survive, every Noble needs to do his part by making a supreme effort to attend and support his Unit whether it is held in person or virtually.

Items discussed were the future of the Outreach Clinic and the possibility of Telemedicine Clinics becoming the way of the future. Telemedicine has the potential for a huge savings on transportation costs.

Since January of this year, El Jebel has spent approximately \$8,000.00 on transporting twenty patients to the Salt Lake Hospital. Some patients went twice a month. El Jebel has paid for ten airline tickets and paid mileage for ten other patients.

The transportation fund has been hit hard this year because of not being able to hold any Outreach Clinics during the past fourteen months. There have only been donations of \$450.00 since the first of the year. We were fortunate to receive a \$10,000.00 bequest, which was deeply appreciated. But, as we all know these types of donations do not happen on a regular basis.

Now that the CDC has relaxed restrictions and the COVID appears to be taking a back seat because of the vaccine, hopefully in September we will be able to have an Outreach Clinic at PSL. We miss seeing the kids!
